NCWM Update on Programs and Activities

Don Onwiler will provide an overview of current activities and programs at the National Conference on Weights and Measures (NCWM) relevant to the weighing industry, including voting items that will be on the agenda for the NCWM's July meeting to amend Handbook 44.

Don began his career as a Grain Warehouse Examiner for the State of Nebraska and later was Program Manager for the Nebraska Weights and Measures Division. During that time, he was also an authorized evaluator under the National Type Evaluation Program for heavy capacity scales. Don served as chairman of the Central Weights and Measures Association in 2004, and in 2006, he was Chairman of the National Conference on Weights and Measures.

In 2008, Don left public service to become Executive Director of the National Conference on Weights and Measures, or NCWM. At NCWM he oversees all aspects of daily operations of the organization which sets the weights and measures standards for the United States. In addition to meetings, membership, publications, and communications, NCWM administers the National Type Evaluation Program for commercial weighing and measuring devices and a Professional Certification Program for weight and measures officials.

Don received his degree in Business Administration from the University of Nebraska at Kearney. He is a native and life-long resident of Nebraska where he and his wife Peggy enjoy their children and grandchildren, sports, gardening and backyard cooking.

Designing Systems Outside the Box

The evolution of connected devices is exploding. The weighing industry has traditionally been very cautious in embracing new technologies.

Successful system integrators “stand on the shoulders of giants” in other disciplines to achieve more without reinventing the wheel. This talk will touch on some of these emerging trends that could complement weighing systems. These including: low cost embedded computers (i.e. Arduino & Raspberry Pi), web messaging (using webhooks, web services and APIs), on-line databases (i.e. Airtable, Google Docs, Wolfram Data Drop), IoT inter-connectivity services (i.e. “If This Then That” & Stringify) and an ever growing number of input, output and communications devices. If we can get just a taste of what is out there, it just might help us design outside the box.

Dan Garlen grew up in the weighing industry as an electronics/software engineer/educator. His education began at Drexel University with a BSEE. He earned several programming certifications (including Microsoft Certified Trainer). Inspired by his mother, who received her PhD after retirement, Dan (as a grandfather) earned his Masters of Engineering Management from University of Pennsylvania. He continues to learn on the fringe of weighing including: IoT and new web programming technologies.

A long-time supporter of the ISWM over his thirty-five years in developing traditional and automated weighing system, Dan worked with many companies including Ohaus, CAS, Rinstrum, Setra, Wipotec and of course KG Systems, which Ken Kardux and he founded. Projects spanned from weigh-feeders, check-weighers, programmable weighing indicators, data acquisition/control/telemetry solutions and other specialized weighing applications.

Dan lives with his wife Marilyn in Philadelphia near his two children and two grandchildren.
